




Election results



Seat distribution



■ Social Democrats (SPD) ■ Christian Democrats (CDU) ■ Greens (Grüne) ■ Nationalist (AfD) ■ Left (Die Linke) ■ SSW



- The German Bundestag has 630 members.
- The absolute majority is reached with 316 members.
- The CDU/CSU group won the election and thus been given the task of leading the next government.



Possible coalitions



So-called Grand Coalition



- CDU/CSU
- SPD
- Opposition (AfD, Greens, Lefts, SSW)

So-called "Kenya coalition"



- CDU/CSU
- SPD
- Greens
- Opposition (AfD, Lefts, SSW)

- Chancellor to be Friedrich Merz always said that he preferred a coalition with just one partner, so it is very unlikely that the so-called Kenya coalition will be formed.
- He has also ruled out a coalition with the second strongest party, the AfD.
- It is therefore very likely that the CDU/CSU and SPD will form a so-called grand coalition with an absolute majority of 328 MPs.
